

## ANDON RYOKAN

For travellers seeking authentic Japanese lodging, staying at a traditional inn or *ryokan* is the best option. The Andon, or "lantern", is popular with visitors on limited budgets and those not interested in the usual impersonal hotel experience. Situated in downtown Tokyo, close to Ueno Park and the capital's oldest temple Senso-ji in Asakusa, the Andon is the "real thing". Japanese knick-knacks are dotted throughout this charming family-run joint, and the friendly English-speaking proprietors clearly relish their role as intermediary between East and West.

Since this is a *ryokan*, patrons sleep on Japanese futons on the floor, which are made up nightly and then neatly folded away each morning. The luxury crowd should be warned, however: bathrooms on each floor are shared, and the proverbial cat swinging may result in a sore head.
