



## ANDON RYOKAN

Traditional Japanese inn updated with cutting-edge minimalist design and low lighting reminiscent of Japanese lanterns

In Tokyo's historic centre close to Ueno, which has the highest concentration of museums and galleries in Japan

24 small doubles equipped with Japanese matting and twin or double futons. All have TVs, DVD players and Internet access

Very much home-from-home.

The owner lives on-site and will help with any requests

The hotel serves a continental breakfast. Guests can use the kitchen and help themselves to tea and coffee

None to speak of – in typical Japanese style, the bedroom windows are covered in handmade paper

Staying here is a real Japanese experience, from the shared Jacuzzi bath on the top floor to the bamboo garden

The rooms are tiny and the only telephone is in the lobby

The owner collects beautiful antiques, which are scattered around the hotel; breakfast is eaten off Meiji period crockery
